We also created **pictures of our homes**; we discussed paying attention to details such as the color of each house, how many windows, what color is the front door, are there stairs to the front door, etc. The children



made such wonderful details as the doorknob on the door, curtains and people in a window, flowers, trees and someone even drew those annoying Poplar tree fuzzies that are blowing around now! The children wrote their street number and name on sentence paper and glued it to the bottom—they're great! On Friday, the kids even created summer

paper flowers to decorate their homes!



We also talked about our Crystal Lake community and all the different places we've visited with our families here. We made a chart of "who's been to ..." The ice cream shop (we counted 5 different ones in Crystal Lake and some children said they've been to all 5!) and Pump It Up were the most frequented.

On Friday, Blue Shirts were everywhere on the playground. Our lunch in the gazebo was especially exciting due to a passing rain shower but we were snug (hot and humid that day!) and dry.


